Legislative/Environmental -Chuck Schonder

4/19/18 South Coastal AARP Day at Legislative Hall – Mark Your Calendar

We will bring our enthusiasm and personalized experiences to Sussex County Legislators degrading our issues.

On 4/19/18 we will be asking legislators to amend HB 268 to make sure seniors (65 years +) who moved here before 1/1/18 and qualify under the three year waiting period be grandfathered, rather than delay their eligibility for the Senior Property Tax credit.

We will also be asking legislators to pass AARP's **Share The Care Act** – which will allow Delaware's 123,000 family caregivers (over half of whom work fulltime or part time) to hire home health aides who (under the proposed Share The Care Act) will be able to give patients medications including routine pills, eye drops, or oxygen. This is currently the law in most states but not in Delaware.

We have rescheduled AARP Lobby Day at Legislative Hall for **Thursday 4/19/18** from **10 AM** to **3 PM**. Can you join us? I hope this works for most of you. Scholarship - Ida Crist & Shirley Price

The Scholarship Committee has proposed and the Board has approved an increase in scholarship awards from \$6,500 to \$9,500 in 2018-2019 school year. Since this is a change to the budget which the membership approved earlier, this increase requires a membership vote, which will take place at the monthly luncheon Tuesday, April. 17.

The \$3,000 increase would go toward increasing the number of nursing college scholarships for Delaware Technical and Community College from one to two. In addition, the amount of the existing nursing scholarship and the new nursing scholarship would be \$2,000 (\$1,000 per semester). Previously, the budget called for one nursing scholarship for a total of \$1,000 for the year and one non-nursing scholarship of \$1,000 for the year. The amount of the non-nursing scholarship will remain the same.

Over the years, the Scholarship Committee has built a reserve through fundraising activities such as the Artisans Fair and Dine and Donate events. The Board felt that some of these funds should be given in additional scholarships rather than having such a large surplus. The budget that was approved earlier included an extra scholarship to Indian River High School students for a total of three scholarships of \$1,500 each, totaling \$4,500.

If approved, the additional scholarship appropriation would bring the total given to Del Tech to \$5,000. The additional funds are designated for nursing students because they require more credits to graduate than non-nursing students to whom our scholarships are awarded, and the cost of their books are more expensive. The Scholarship Committee believes that helping students become nurses in our geographic area will directly benefit our senior citizen population which AARP serves.

Driver's Safety Classes - Joan King

You must take the Refresher Class every three (3) years to continue to receive a discount on your auto liability insurance. The State is now mandating that you cannot take the Refresher Class prior to 90 days expiration of your current certificate.
