Scholarship Committee

A Tree of Life copper sculpture, donated by Copper Creations of Melfa, VA, a long-time Artisans Fair exhibitor, will be offered via raffle tickets at October's luncheon meeting and at the October Dine and Donate.

The Dine and Donate will be from 11 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 29, at the Cottage Café in Bethany Beach. Featured will be gift baskets, a 50-50 cash raffle and the copper sculpture. The Tree of Life sculpture is 36" round with a value of \$250 and is suitable for indoor or outdoor display.

The proceeds from the Dine and Donate help support our scholarship fund. Beginning in 2025, we will give a total of \$10,000 in scholarships to Indian River High School students and adult students at Delaware Technical and Community College. The Scholarship Committee recommended, and the Board approved an additional \$1,000 scholarship per semester for a student at Del Tech whose area of study is related to the health field. This may include nursing or auxiliary health fields. We give two \$1,500 scholarships to Indian River High School students annually.

The addition of this new scholarship to Del Tech brings annual giving to the community college to \$7,000. Our total annual scholarship awards will go from \$8,000 to \$10,000. These funds are raised by the annual Artisans Fair, which is held the Saturday of Memorial Day weekend; two Dine and Donate events, one in the spring and one in the fall; and various donations. Thank you to Don and Donna Drew of Copper Creations for the generous gift of the Tree of Life sculpture.

Legislative/Environmental Committee

Sheila Grant, Associate State Director of Advocacy, AARP Delaware, sent us the following update on what's happening at the State level that we should be aware of.

The Delaware General Assembly's session ended in June, and many of the bills and funding supported by AARP passed. Although many bills are still awaiting the Governor's signature, so far he has signed bills aimed at creating more affordable and workforce housing units, reforming nursing homes, and increasing funding to the Division of Aging. Still awaiting his signature are bills to ensure accessible polling places, prevent discrimination in housing, and educate consumers about gift card fraud.

In 2025, we expect to continue working to pass Sick Time and Safety Leave and Real Property Transfer on Death Deed. We're also planning to work on housing issues, transportation, fraud, and caregiving.

As AARP Delaware creates the 2025 State Plan, we would be interested to hear from chapter members about which issues are most important to them. Please email Ted Spickler at arcadywood@gmail.com to let him know which of the issues below are most important to you. You may list more than one.

- Protecting Social Security and Medicare
- Being able to age in your current home/community
- Having affordable housing in your community
- Getting to the places you need to go, independently
- Improving pedestrian and traffic safety
- Affordability of prescription drugs
- Support for family caregivers (like a caregiver tax credit or nursing home reform)
- Protecting yourself from fraud

AARP Delaware would love to have the South Coastal AARP Chapter members join us on the First State Action Team, visiting with legislators, writing letters to the editor, giving presentations to community groups, providing testimony at committee hearings, helping to plan Lobby Day, and more.
