Legislative/Environmental - Chuck Schonder

During the State General Assembly Legislative Session (1/1/21 – 6/30/21) Committee members, Mary Louise Embrey, Ted Spickler and myself attended biweekly zoom meetings of AARP Delaware's First State Advocacy Committee's planning and legislative strategy meetings to carry forward favorable senior state legislation. We focused on two major bills. HB 48 - New Primary Care Health Care Providers Loan Repayment Program that will award up to \$50,000 per year for a maximum of 4 years of service in underserved areas of Delaware like Sussex County. This passed both houses unanimously and was recently signed by the Governor! Our other project HB 205 - Delaware Earns is a multiyear effort by AARP and the State Treasurer to establish a retirement plan for small employers who don't have the resources to sponsor such plans. According to research from Georgetown University Center for Retirement Initiatives, 38% of the states' workforce (more than 145,000 workers) do not have access to employer-sponsored retirement plans.

Scholarship Fund-Raising Efforts Continue

These monies are vital to continue to fund our scholarship efforts, since we were not able to hold fund-raising activities, such as the Artisans Fair and a Dine and Donate, in 2020 or thus far in 2021. However, if COVID protocols permit, we plan to have a Dine and Donate event in November. Details will follow in an upcoming newsletter. At chapter luncheons and at the Dine and Donate, we will be selling raffle tickets for a beautiful quilt, *Set Sail*, made by local chapter members (see related article).

Two Indian River High School students received scholarships of \$1,000 each to attend college this fall. They are Declan Burke, who will be attending Salisbury University, and Destin Smyth, who will be attending Georgia Institute of Technology. Another \$1,500 was donated to Delaware Technical and Community College for three students this fall.

Quilt Raffle to Benefit Scholarship Program

Members of our Chapter created a quilt called "Set Sail."

Proceeds will fund scholarships to students at Indian River High School and adult students at Delaware Technical and Community College, awarded by the AARP Chapter's Scholarship Committee. We were unable to continue selling tickets due to COVID. We are now starting tickets sales: 6 for \$5 or 15 for \$10. We will award the quilt at an upcoming chapter event, no later than Saturday, May 30, 2022, at the Artisan's Fair, depending on Covid protocols.

Day Trips

- Payment is preferred at time of registration and must be made no later than 30 days after registration
- Reservations made within 30 days of scheduled trip must be paid at time of registration
- No refunds for payments can be given unless a substitution can be made. If a trip is cancelled by the Tour Committee, full refunds will be provided to all paid participants.

- No alcoholic beverages are allowed on buses during chapter-sponsored trips
- Price subject to change: If the price of diesel fuel increases by more than 20% between the date of the contract with Bus Company and the date of the charter, the Tour Committee may charge a fuel surcharge to participants.
