Chapter Receives Grant Award

The Chapter has received a Chapter Awareness Grant in the amount of \$1,000 from the AARP national office. The purpose of these funds is to increase Chapter awareness in the community, retain existing Chapter members and/or recruit and engage new Chapter members.
